THEME FOR 2023: "O to be Like Thee" 1 Peter 1:7

O GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD by Josh Manning

As we all well know, it is November, the season of Thanksgiving. And we have been thinking about why it is that we should work diligently to be individuals characterized by thankfulness. Today we are going to begin with a verse we used recently: 1 Chronicles 16:34 tells us, "Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever."

When we look at this verse and contemplate the reasons we have to engage in thanksgiving, the answer we are given is this: God is good. From a human point of view, this logic might seem odd or even counterintuitive. When we think about our reasons for being thankful, we often begin contemplating ourselves and our own circumstances. It goes something like this, "I am thankful because I have..." or "I am thankful because I am...." However, what the Bible teaches us is that in order for us to be truly thankful people, we have to learn how to think less of ourselves and more of God. The Bible leads us to think in this way: "I am thankful because God...".

There are two ideas that are repeated throughout the Bible that are tied to this idea of finding reasons for giving thanks in God. First, we should be thankful for Who God is. Second, we should be thankful for what God has done. Both of these ideas come from the sentiments expressed in 1 Chronicles 16:34, "Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good!" His character is good, and His actions are good. Not only have they been good, but they will remain good forever.


What are some ways that we can see that God is good? Well, His is a character and heart defined by love: "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. He who does not love does not know God, for God is love" (1 John 4:7-8). But He is more than a single positive attribute. Ours is a holy God: "And one cried to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!" (Isaiah 6:3). Could we find any other things that help us see that God is good? Of course! But in order to catalogue all His goodness, it would require a rather lengthy book. One comes to mind.

Now let's take a moment to think about the good things that God has done. Immediately we contemplate that everything God creates is "good" (Genesis 1). Then we remember the goodness of His word that He has given to us: "Open my eyes, that I may see wondrous things from Your law" (Psalm 119:18). Next, we meditate on words like covenant, promises, redemption, salvation, faithfulness, and presence. The Bible is a revelation of the good works of our good God! Are not the works of God reasons enough to give thanks?

Finally, practically speaking, there is a transformation of goodness that occurs within our lives when we draw near to our good God (cf.1 Peter 1:15-16; Romans 12:1-2). When we follow and serve this good God, as His character and His actions are good, we become like Him in His attributes of goodness and His deeds of love and holiness. In fact, it is only through faith that we have any claim to goodness at all, both now and in eternity. "Oh, give thanks to the Lord! Call upon His name; Make known His deeds among the peoples!" (1 Chronicles 16:8).


