THEME FOR 2024: DISCIPLESHIP ON DISPLAY

By This All Will Know That You Are My Disciples by Josh Manning


What is the Bible about? From time to time we hear people make statements about the great theme (or themes) of the Bible: "the Bible is about the love of God", or "the Bible tells us about God and His will", or "the Bible is the story of redemption." One of the reasons it is common to hear people talk about the big themes of scripture is because there are so many major themes repeated throughout the biblical narrative. For our thoughts today, I would like to draw our attention to one such biblical themes: Leadership.

It should be obvious in the opening scenes of the Bible that God is portrayed as being King over all creation. He made everything and determined the "how" and "what" and "why" of everything. His word (another important theme of the Bible) designed and brought forth the universe. Thus, the creation story introduces the motif of leadership to the story of the Bible—a motif that the rest of scripture bears out.

But when we begin reading the Bible "in the beginning" we also learn that leadership is something that God shares with others. "Then God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.' So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. Then God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth" (Genesis 1:26-28). Man (both male and female) is given a great degree of authority over God's creation. This is highlighted by the repeated use of the word "dominion" in Genesis 1. When we move into Genesis 2, this idea of man's "dominion" and leadership is described by Adam's God-given head gardener position: "Then the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to tend and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, 'Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die" (Genesis 2:15-17). Man is given dominion (a leadership role) in chapter 1. Then, in chapter 2, we are shown how man was to exercise that leadership. First, man's leadership is something given by God. This is called delegated leadership. Second, man's leadership is something that should be governed by God's word. Notice that we find the word "commanded" in Genesis 2:16. Third, we see that man's role as leader over creation is "finite" through the giving of limitations: if man transgresses and goes beyond his delegated authority, then there is a punishment promised (i.e. "you shall surely die"). And fourth, man's leadership is something that was designed to bring about the mutual blessing and flourishing of all of creation. Man was given a work that would bring him (and as the population grew, "them") both purpose and honor. And creation was given someone to care for it, to "tend and keep it" (Genesis 2:15). So, what we see from the beginning is that leadership is a position of delegated authority whereby man was called to exercise authority over creation as image bearers of God. Leaders are to be godly.


